 Competitors should complete the online Entry Form and submit any music or words no later than 11.59pm on Friday 26th April 2024. Entries received after this date will not be accepted.

Please follow all instructions in the entry form and name submitted documents in the following style: Competition number_name of competitor_name of piece.

2. Small fees are necessary to cover costs such as venue hire, adjudicator expenses and web hosting. Entry Fees are £3 per competition. Please make payment by online transfer to our bank account, using your family name as a reference.

- **3.** All written, spoken, and sung material must be in the Scottish Gaelic language, and should reflect Gaelic culture and tradition. Instrumental music should be of Gaelic origin.
- 4. All competitions will be judged and graded on overall presentation by the adjudicator(s). Only the first three places in each competition will be identified, but all competitors will receive an adjudication. The adjudicators' decision is final.
- **5.** All entries should be the competitor's own, uncorrected work.
- **6.** Each competitor may only enter any individual competition once. (A competitor can enter more than one, different, competition.)
- 7. No competitor shall sing the same song, recite the same poem, or play the same tune in any two competitions.
- 8. Competitors should perform from memory, except in competitions J18, J19, J20, & J21.
- 9. There are no prescribed pieces for vocal, oral and musical competitions. All competitions are own choice and all competitors must detail the name of their performance piece on the entry form. One clear, and legible, copy of the music (.pdf) and, where applicable, the words (.pdf or .doc) must be submitted as instructed on the entry form. Please name submitted documents in the following style: Competition number_name of competitor_name of piece.
- All literary entries must be submitted typed, and in Word format (.doc). In competitions L04, L05 & L06 the prose writing may be reflective, persuasive, or creative. [See Rule No. 5]
- 11. In Competition E01, as a Short Film it can be any genre [perhaps in a documentary-style

or using stop-motion] or as a Vlog (Video Log) it could be something like: An Obair a b' Fheàrr Leam (My Dream Job) or it could be topical, for example, Blàthachadh na Cruinne (Global Warming), or Iomadachd (Diversity). Explore FilmG for inspiration. (Minimum length is 30 seconds; maximum length is 5 minutes.)

- **12.** Competitions **E01**, **E02** & **S07** are open to individuals or to groups.
- 13. In Competitions M19, M20 & S09 groups of 3 or more should perform one accompanied Gaelic song (or set of puirt-a-beul) not exceeding 6 minutes' duration. Each performer may only enter in one group. No individual adjudications will be given.
- 14. In Competition \$10, groups of 3 or more should perform one set for dancing (Pick from the following dances: Canadian Barn Dance / Gay Gordons / Schottische / Dashing White Sergeant / St. Bernard's Waltz). One over 21 (e.g. tutor or parent) may be involved in each group. Each performer may only enter in one group. No individual adjudications will be given.
- 15. In Competition J12 groups of 3-6 competitors should recite a bardachd. Any style of performance is permitted but each member of the group must take some part in the performance. Small props and costumes are permitted.
- 16. In Competitions **J18, J19, J20, & J21**, the competitor will be given 5 minutes to read over the passage before reading it aloud. The competitor must not be given any assistance with how to pronounce, pace, or otherwise deliver the reading.
- Any file type will be accepted [including (but not limited to) .mp4 / .mov / .wmv] with a file size of up to 1GB and submitted using a file sharing service such as WeTransfer, Dropbox, or GoogleDrive. YouTube/Vimeo URL links will not be accepted. Please name submitted files / documents in the following style: Competition number_name of competitor_name of piece.

In-Person Competitions

All attendees of in-person competitions must follow instructions of the Local Mòd stewards, and abide by social distancing rules set by the venue.
